

## Commitment to sourcing 100% cage-free eggs: Progress update March 2026

This update provides insight into our progress towards sourcing 100% cage-free shelled eggs and egg products (including liquid eggs, powdered or processed eggs) across our global operations.

Belmond remains committed to sourcing only cage-free eggs by 2030, including eggs used in baked goods and other products.

Our continued focus through 2025–2026 has been on improving data accuracy, strengthening supplier engagement, and transitioning remaining supply chains to fully cage-free sourcing.

### Since our previous update, we have:

- Onboarded a dedicated team member to coordinate data reporting for this programme as part of our sustainable sourcing strategy.
- Achieved 91% cage-free compliance across whole egg and liquid/processed egg products globally

### Progress and Challenges:

We continue to track progress at the property level; however, this approach presents limitations in fully reflecting total egg volumes across the portfolio.

To address this, we have started work towards standardising data collection methodologies across all properties. This will enable more accurate reporting based on equivalent egg volumes.

Our initial focus has been on the largest impact area in our business - whole eggs, liquid and processed egg products. We have now started a data collection exercise with pilot properties to get better visibility on eggs embedded as ingredients in baked goods and other products. Our initial is to have this mapped during 2026 so we can develop a concrete action plan for these products globally.

**Next Steps:**

We are actively working to:

- Develop transition plans and strengthen supplier engagement in regions with local supply constraints.
- Standardise data collection across all properties into comparable volume-based metrics
- Expand reporting scope to include eggs embedded in purchased and prepared products

We remain committed to making meaningful progress, with a comprehensive update covering all egg products and improved data standardization planned for December 2026.
